He eventually succeeded in finding shelter in a x sunken road, where there was another of my Pilots who was an eve witness to the shove events.

had Light. W.L. Field been stunned as was quite probable; the machine diving straight into the ground owing to the elevator controls being severed, the Officer would undoubtably have saved the life of Light. W.L. Field.
