Dear Sons:-

Perhaps to make my letter of yesterday plainer you had better cable what you approve of in one word and I would suggest "Arlington"

We both approve of a further expenditure of say \$25000, for a further building west say \$4500, and \$18000 for more tools to increase our output of shells.

"Brunswick"

We both approve of an additional \$9000 expenditure for tools to put in extension just completed.

It seems to me if the war keeps up another year we would be justified in expending "Arlington" but if not "Brunswick" would be all we could risk.
