My dear Sarah:-

We all thought of you many times Saturday and yesterday out on the blue sea on your voyage back to England. Mother got a letter from your dear Mother when you got back to Westchester and was so glad to learn there was no ill effects from her trip to London. I am sure we would all have enjoyed a longer visit if it were possible. Some day I hope it will and that soon.

I was quite happy yesterday in getting a cable "All well" from Ibb and to-day a nice business letter practically approving of what we have done in business this last two months. My heart is very full at both Ibb and Wood's preservation one nearly two years and one one year without a mishap. Surely the Dear Lord is keeping them.

Wood said he would send the shell album to Mr. Blair who was to send it to you for Mrs. C.L. Leonard and any other friends to see. When you get through I wish you would send it by Parcel Post to George Stewart, Calgary, Alberta, Canada as per enclosed envelope which you could paste on its case, and whatever you are out in postage I will remit. When you get it off (taking your own time) drop me a card so I can notify G. Stewart what to expect.

We had Aubrey for Sunday and such a happy Sunday with the grandsons.

The snapshots including your dear Mother and self came out very well.

I am in receipt of a letter from Ibb dated 29th May announcing his and Wood's approval of what had been done in buildings and machinery. This is very gratifying.

We are having a little brighter weather now and expect a great fruit crop, but our ground crops grains especially will be more or less a failure.
