Shipped a carload of stock to St. John including an order that Evens sent us for a small 8 x 8 Jewell engine and an old builer No. 2008 which we were glad to get rid of. We also put on this cer Simpsons order for 54° x 14° beiler which we have had on hand about four years. Mr. Simpson is going to end fire this beiler with a Dutch even which we do not approve of. Made a deposit of \$6606.00 from I.M.B. Shipped 970 shells to-day. Other sources make a total deposit of \$3663.00.
