Our total sales for the month of March \$266,200.00.
Total output of shells for month 11,882.

April 3rd.

TUESDAY.

We received to-day from the I.M.B. cheque for \$12,172.94.

WEDNESDAY

April 4th.

Received several small collections amounting to \$375.00.
Mr. Leonard left to-day for a short holiday to Atlantic City.
Would say he was pretty well when he left, had almost fully
recovered his late illness.

THURSDAY

April 5th.

Business very quiet. Shipped car of shells to-day. Only a couple
of small cash settlements to-day. Received signed contract from
Mr. Hicks for 54 x 14 Boiler now in stock to be shipped May 15th.

FRIDAY

April 6th.

Good Friday. Most of the men at work. The weather very disagreeable,
snowing nearly all day, Mr. Morgan here the entire day and we think is
improving gradually.

SATURDAY

April 7th.

Several settlements this morning from Montreal in all \$530.00.
Mr. Evans \$338.00. Paid \$4367.00 to 217 men including \$1864.00 piece
work. We are paying to-day Saturday. The Boiler shop, moulding shop
and S.I. shop closed down until Monday. Weather bright, clear & cool.

George Stewart writes the Bassano Electric Company Directors had
accepted an offer for the purchase of this plant for \$7,000. \$2,000
cash, \$1,000 every six months, and if sale goes through we should get
our funds or at least part of same in the near future.

The London City Engineering Dept. has given us the order for bottom for
