MONDAY

March 26th.

We received several settlements to-day most of which are small accounts. C. McFarlane \$122.02. S. Landry \$207.00, Municipal Home St. John \$109.84 and 20 smaller accounts aggregating \$200. The Northfield Coal Co. \$209. H.S. Godard (\$41.42).

TUESDAY

March 27th.

Shipped 10 H.P. Boiler to H. Lussier \$250.00. Shipped Acme Cheese Co. 18 R.T. Boiler \$400.00. Thos. Claire paid \$30.00 on account of note to-day. Papineauville Fdry Co. settled their account \$140.00. Parisian Steam Laundry paid \$200.00. Deviney & Campbell \$100.00.

WEDNESDAY

March 28th.

Shipped to-day 988 shells. Deviney & Campbell paid \$100. on acct boiler. McClary Compan paid \$307.50 for balance on boiler. Several smaller accounts settled amounting to \$150.00.

THURSDAY

March 29th.

Patterson Bros. paid \$406.60. British War Office \$6498.00 for boilers. 13 to 14 small settlements received to-day about \$140.00.

FRIDAY

March 30th.

Shipped 982 shells to-day. Paid \$4523.84 to 217 men including \$2044. piece work. No settlements to-day of any account.

SATURDAY

March 31st.

Dept. of Justice paid \$75.00 for 100 lbs. babbitt metal. Montreal Water & Power paid \$71.85. Longfield Bros. \$971.25. Powers & Brewer \$70.30, a few sundry small accounts about \$40.00

Shipped car of shells containing 988.

Cars loaded Mar. 26th to 31st.

3 - cars finished shells  
1 " boilers

Cars unloaded

2 cars shell boxes  
4 cars coal  
3 cars shell forgings.

The month of March was the largest output for shells being 11882, being an average of 400 per day each working day, to date we have shipped over 106,000, 60 prs. We had a long distance call from Toronto from the I.M.B. informing us that there would be no more orders for 60 Prs. placed after completion of the present order and that 4.5 were more in demand and wanted to know if we could change over and make 4.5, would also say that they are paying \$3.25 for Mark VII 4.5 shells which we think is a better proposition than the 60 Prs. and will not be so hard on men and machinery.

Mr. Morgan is still away and has been now for about two weeks, but is improving gradually from day to day.

We are pleased to report that Mr. Leonard is able to be around at the office the last few days for which we are all very pleased.

We have had shipped from Calgary the 2- 35 H.P. Oilwell Boilers and 40 H.P. Upright Boiler from Montreal. Mr. Plant has sold the Upright Boiler to Mr. O'Connell for the Customs Warehouse for \$770.00 delivered on the premises, so that the extra we have obtained on this one boiler will cover the expenses of freight on the whole car.

Our general business is very quiet, there are a few enquiries from our Winnipeg man who has sold a 54 x 14 in Fort William. We sold the Dominion Cannery 60 ft. 42" smoke stack for \$363.00 No. 10 & 12 ga.

We placed an order with Theo. Robertson & Co. for 100 tons plate at \$4.25 base F.O.B. mills, the best delivery we could get was about July of 1918 with the understanding that if we are not able to use the material that they will take it off our hands, we also want to place a little order for boiler tubes for delivery about the same time.
