Complying with the NIH Public Access Policy

As of April 7, 2008, all investigators funded by the National Institutes of Health must deposit an electronic version of the final peer reviewed, accepted manuscript into the National Library of Medicine's PubMed Central within 12 months of publication.

How to comply with the policy

- 1. The NIH Public Access Policy applies to all peer-reviewed articles that arise, in whole or in part, from direct costs, those specifically identified with a particular project or activity funded by NIH, or from NIH staff, that are accepted for publication on or after April 7, 2008.
- 2. Institutions and investigators are responsible for ensuring that any publishing or copyright agreements concerning submitted articles fully comply with this Policy.
- 3. <u>PubMed Central (PMC)</u> is the NIH digital archive of full-text, peer-reviewed journal articles. Its content is publicly accessible and integrated with other databases.
- 4. The final, peer-reviewed manuscript includes all graphics and supplemental materials that are associated with the article.
- Beginning May 25, 2008, anyone submitting an application, proposal or progress report to the NIH must include the <u>PMC or NIH Manuscript</u> <u>Submission reference number</u> when citing applicable articles that arise from their NIH funded research. This policy includes applications submitted to the NIH for the May 25, 2008 due date and subsequent due dates.
