Administrative History

Joseph Clark, the founder of Caradoc Mills, was born in Cumberland, England in 1811. After immigrating to Canada in the 1830s, Clark established a mill in Southwold Township, Elgin County. He purchased property at range 1 south, lot 21 in Caradoc Township, Middlesex County in 1849; his newly-constructed mill was functional within a year.

Known variously as Clark's Mills and Caradoc Mills, Clark's operation included gristing, chopping, and carding. Joseph Clark retired in about 1884, leaving his son Edward to continue milling along with long-time worker, Robert Tupholme. Joseph Clark died in 1886, and the mill remained in the family until about 1907, when it was sold. The original mill was destroyed by fire in 1900 and was rebuilt on the original site. The mill changed hands several times, and was eventually torn down sometime in the 1950s.

Scope and Content

This fonds contains the business records of Caradoc Mills. Record books, financial documents, and samples of flour bags are included. The two earliest books relate to Clark's first mill in Southwold Township, Elgin County.
