**Administrative History**

Western University's offer to provide a hospital unit for overseas service was officially accepted by the War Office in April 1916. At the request of the Board of Governors, Dr. Edwin Seaborn, a member of the University's Faculty of Medicine, was appointed to command the unit at the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel. Authorized for 14 officers, 27 nursing sisters and 118 other ranks, personnel recruited for the unit included faculty and alumni physicians, nurses graduated from Victoria Hospital and St. Joseph's Hospital, Western students, and area residents. Surgical and medical supplies were collected and donated to the unit by the London branch of the Canadian Red Cross. The unit embarked for England in June and August of 1916. Following a period of instruction, officers and other ranks were dispersed to various hospitals. Seaborn and some unit personnel assumed the operation of Ravenscroft Military Hospital at Seaford, Sussex in November of 1916, and of All Saints Hospital, (renamed Canadian Military Hospital) in Eastbourne, Sussex in January of the next year. Its unit strength restored in November of 1917, the unit proceeded to Calais, France to take over a 400-bed hospital in December. While in operation, the No.10 Canadian Stationary Hospital admitted over 16,000 patients. Demobilized in April, 1919, the unit returned to London, Ontario, at the end of May.

**Scope and Content**

The fonds consists of materials related to the establishment, operation and demobilization of the No. 10 Canadian Stationary Hospital. Included are the unit's history and war diaries; official and personal correspondence; orders and official communications; financial, personnel, patient and supply records; photographs and memorabilia.

Arrangement follows the general order of Seaborn's list of documents, found in the Unit History series with the following exceptions: orders (part I, part II and daily order books) have been consolidated into a single series; regimental returns, handing over documents and registered letters have each been consolidated; Emergency Fund vouchers have been included in an Accounts series consolidating the unit's various financial records. A Photographs series and an Objects series have been identified and described to reflect the scope of the unit's records, and a Restricted Originals series has been created by the archivist to accommodate fragile and acidic records removed from the files for conservation purposes.

**Language of the Material**

In English and French.

**Finding Aids**

File and item lists available.

**Conditions Governing Access**

1. Access to some of these records may be subject to the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* and will require submission of a Research Access Request.
2. Access restrictions, for preservation reasons, apply to Series 21 Accounts, Series 24 Objects and Series 25 Restricted Originals.

### **Related Material**

Additional textual records and photographs relating to the No. 10 hospital can be found in the Edwin Seaborn Fonds and Collection. Correspondence relating to donations for the hospital can be found in the papers of Edward Ernest Braithwaite in the Office of the President Fonds. Photographs of nursing sisters and a listing of the nurses travelling overseas in 1916 can be found in the Helen Woolson Fonds. Additional photographs of the hospital and staff can be found in the 1932 edition of *Occidentalia*, located in the Archives and Research Collections Centre Reading Room.

### **Custodial History**

According to a letter filed in the Unit History series, Dr. Seaborn had custody of the hospital's records in October of 1924.

### **Immediate Source of Acquisition**

The exact date and means of the acquisition of the textual records and most photographs are not known. The flag was donated to The University of Western Ontario in 1943 by Mel Brock, who served as Quartermaster for the No. 10 hospital.

### **Notes**

1. In June of 1917, the Lombardo Orchestra performed at a garden party held at Western University to raise funds for the hospital's Emergency Fund. Records relating to this event, including a receipt signed by Guy Lombardo, can be found in Series 21 Accounts.
2. Fragile documents have been photocopied. Originals have been removed from files and placed in the Restricted Originals series. Some originals have been duplex copied to conserve paper.

**Scope and Content**

Series consists of orders affecting the operations and staff of the No. 10 hospital as a military unit. Issued daily by the commanding officer, Orders Part I relate to the unit and record training, parades and inspections; include information sent in circulars and memoranda, and regulations; define out of bounds areas; and inform about events, educational courses, social activities and church services. Orders Part II relate to matters affecting personnel, including promotions and appointments, leave, reassignments, punishments, stoppages of pay, hospital admissions and discharges, and casualties. Orders Part II provided the basis for compiling statistics of the strengths and casualties of the Canadian Expeditionary Force.

**Arrangement**

Entries in both Part I and Part II are numbered consecutively for each year, with some omissions, duplication and corrections.

**Notes**

1. Orders Part II entries from January 6 to October 9, 1917 have been torn or cut from another volume.
2. Title of the series is based on Seaborn's list of documents.

**Scope and Content**

Series consists of regimental returns filed weekly by the commanding officer of the unit. The returns include: a confidential report detailing requirements or improvements needed, visitors, diseases treated, and the number of hospital admissions, discharges, evacuations and deaths; a field return of the unit strength, additions or transfers, and the current number of patients; nominal rolls of officers, nursing sisters, dental corps personnel and specialists; a report of civilians employed by the hospital; a roll of court-martial prisoners; offence, leave and sick reports; and a report of cases of drunkenness.

**Scope and Content**

Series primarily consists of records documenting the hospital's contacts with the Canadian Red Cross Society Stores Department in Boulogne-sur-Mer, France. Includes correspondence relating to supplies and equipment, sports materials and items for the recreation hut; and requisitions and despatch sheets relating to orders for food, hospital, kitchen and office supplies, recreation and hardware items, blankets, toiletries and garden seeds. Includes some box content slips for supplies sent to the hospital in 1917 from London and from the IODE in Hamilton, Ontario.

**Scope and Content**

Series consists of applications, donation letters, the correspondence of Western University President Edward Ernest Braithwaite, and the correspondence of Edwin Seaborn. The applications consist of letters from physicians, nurses and students offering to serve with the No. 10 hospital or recommending others as potential candidates. The donations letters include communications to and replies from Braithwaite concerning donations to the hospital's Emergency Fund. Braithwaite's correspondence primarily consists of letters and copies of letters to and from Seaborn about the status of the No. 10 hospital and its staff, the Emergency Fund, ward tablets, and Braithwaite's sons Lloyd and Scott, the latter of whom served with the No. 10. Some of Seaborn's letters were later edited for newspaper publication. The first volume of Seaborn's correspondence includes requests for commissions, the return of staff, addresses, and information about accommodations, the condition of patients or the whereabouts of missing soldiers; invitations; and letters from families of soldiers killed in action. The second volume consists of correspondence to Braithwaite and Lady Beck of the London branch of the Canadian Red Cross, and includes reports on the hospital's work, lists of donors to the Emergency Fund, lists of names on ward tablets, and statements of the status of Red Cross supplies and Emergency Fund receipts and expenditures.

**Notes**

1. Seaborn's letter of April 24, 1918 gives a detailed account of the hospital's procedures for treatment of the wounded.
2. Included in Braithwaite's correspondence is a letter typed on birchbark from Private Blyth Thomas.
3. Page one of Seaborn's letter of December 4, 1917 to C.R. Somerville is included in volume one; page two is included in volume two, among the correspondence with Lady Beck.
4. Surgical equipment for the hospital was provided in 1916 by the London branch of the Canadian Red Cross.

**Scope and Content**

Series consists of two regulation books of numbered three-part forms used to record the personal belongings of patients admitted to the No. 10 hospital. Among the frequently recorded belongings were cash, jewellery, watches and medals.

**Arrangement**

Receipts issued to the commanding officer and the patient were removed from the book and later reinserted with the corresponding counterfoil remaining in the book.

**Scope and Content**

Series consists of memoranda circulars received by the No. 10 hospital. The circulars relate to a variety of subjects, including orders, regulations and forms, leave, air raids, reporting and evacuation of casualties, clothing and equipment, medical and surgical supplies, treatments, vaccines, food supplies and gardens, and demobilization. Included is an architectural drawing for the hospital's recreation hut, constructed with sponsorship from the Red Cross.

**Arrangement**

Circulars were marked with a two-part identifier (e.g., 15/322) indicating the memoranda circular number (15) and the sequential Office Number (322) assigned when entered in the Register of Letters (Series 12). The Index to the Register (Series 12) includes an alphabetical listing of circular memoranda by topic. Once a number was assigned to a topic, the same number was assigned to subsequent memoranda circulars relating to the same subject. Materials have been arranged by assigned memoranda circular number only.

## Notes

- 22 W.A.A.C.: Established in February 1917 the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps was made up of volunteers, eventually 57,000 in number, and was formally under the control of the War Office and part of the British Army. The first W.A.A.C.'s went to France in March of 1917. The organization was officially renamed Queen Mary's Auxiliary Army Corps in April, 1918, but the title was not generally accepted and members continued to be known as W.A.A.C.'s. The women were largely employed in cooking and catering, storekeeping, clerical work, telephony and administration, printing, and motor vehicle maintenance.
- 183 Green Envelopes: Providing free postage, green envelopes were issued to personnel on active service for their correspondence.
- 457 Queen Mary's Needlework Guild: Founded as the London Guild Unions in 1882 by Lady Wolverton to supply clothing to an orphanage, the charity came under the patronage of the Duchess of York (later Queen Mary) in 1885. The guild was expanded and renamed Queen Mary's London Needlework Guild in 1914, and provided knitted garments to the sick and wounded during World War I. The guild continues as Queen Mary's Clothing Guild.
- 458 Almeric Paget Military Massage Corps: Originally founded as a civilian organization in England by Mr. and Mrs, Almeric Paget, the corps included 50 trained masseuses who worked with wounded soldiers, especially those with muscle injuries. Accepted by the War Office, the corps began work at medical facilities in France in 1917. By the end of the war, the corps included 2,000 staff members.
- 489 G.S.V.A.D.'s and Q.M.A.A.C: Organized by the British Red Cross, Voluntary Aid Detachments were formed in 1909 to provide medical assistance in time of war. Given basic first aid and nursing training by the St. John Ambulance Brigade, V.A.D.'s worked as assistant nurses, ambulance drivers and cooks. During World War I, military authorities were initially unwilling to accept V.A.D.'s on the front line, but removed this restriction 1915 to allow volunteers, mostly women, to serve on the Western Front. For Q.M.A.A.C., see note above for 22 W.A.A.C.
