## Complying with the SSHRC, NSERC, and CHIR Open Access Mandates

As of May 1st, 2015, peer reviewed journal publications arising out of all Tri-Agency supported research must be freely accessible within 12 months of publication. The policy also applies to grants awarded by CHIR from 2008 onward.

## How to comply with the policy

## An article is considered "freely accessbile" if it is:

 Deposited in an institutional repository, such as <u>Scholarship@Western</u>, or a disciplinary repository, such as <u>arXiv</u>. Western Libraries is pleased to assist with mediated deposit of your articles into Scholarship@Western at no cost to you. Please contact <u>scholarship@uwo.ca</u> for information and assistance.

Note: Academic sharing sites such as <u>Academia.edu</u> do not meet the standard as laid out in the Tri-Agency open access policy.

2. Published in an open access journal, provided that open access is guaranteed within one year of publication. The <u>Directory of Open Access Journals</u> is an excellent resource for finding quality open access journals.

Note: Publishing in this manner may incur an additional article processing fee (APF) or open access fee. These costs must be paid by you, however are eligible expenses under the <u>use of grant funds</u> policies of the Tri-Agencies.
