

The D.B. Weldon Library maintains a large collection of research materials in microform. This *Guide* is intended to improve access to research sets, which for reasons of format or indexing may be difficult to use. Included are approximately 175 catalogued research sets or collections. As a general rule, individual monographs in microform (i.e. not parts of series) have been excluded from this publication, as have coded government publications research sets, and individual newspaper and periodical titles.

The following information is supplied for each entry: title; publisher; call number; holdings; format; description of contents; bibliographical access; and how to locate an item within a research set.

Entries are arranged by Library of Congress call number; the *Guide* also includes indexes by title and subject.

Since new titles are regularly added to our holdings, this *Guide* will never be complete. We welcome any suggestions for additions and/or corrections (emantz@uwo.ca).

Its mandate was to identify, locate, and microfiche a retrospective Canadiana collection, to be as comprehensive as possible, which would serve to improve access to printed Canadiana by bringing together fragmented collections, making rare and scarce materials more widely available, and ensuring the preservation of early Canadiana, whether held in Canada or abroad.

The Early Canadiana research collection has been developed in three distinct phases to date (April 2001): Phase I - Pre-1900 Monographs (complete); Phase II - Pre-1900 Periodicals and Annuals (complete); Phase III - Monographs 1900-1920 (complete).

Phase I of the project was limited to monographic materials, and includes only materials with imprints dating pre-1900. The collection covers all relevant items printed in Canada, as well as items printed outside Canada which had Canadian content or were written by Canadians: monographs, pamphlets, leaflets, playbills and broadsides, catalogues of books, articles for sale or commercial products, offprints, and non-Canadian government publications with Canadian content. Monographs form the majority of the collection.

Phase II focussed on serials, and contains annuals and periodicals to 1900, Canadian imprints only.

Phase III began in 1994, and involved the production of microfiche of Canadian imprints from the period 1900 to 1920. This collection contains monographs and pamphlets, with primarily Canadian imprints. A selected bibliography of Canadian authors' works published outside Canada was also reproduced.

Excluded from the collection are Canadian federal, provincial, and territorial government publications. Also excluded are journals and newspapers, manuscript materials, engraved materials, currency, topographical views, portraits, and caricatures.
